

Examples of Best Practices and Activities Developed by ACP-EU Minerals Phase II

Regional-level activities and Country-level activities in 10 Countries selected: Cameroon, Guinea, Fiji, Jamaica, Uganda, Zambia selected in Phase I and Burkina Faso, Republic of Congo, Tanzania and Suriname recently selected in Phase II.

1. Support Institutions to enable environment for gender-inclusive operationalization and formalization of ASMEs along the Development Minerals value chain and improve geological system:

- Country training to support the formalization of ASMEs
- Regional training on geo-data mapping and country workshops for training of trainers (TOTs)
- Studies of available geo-data at the country level
- Small grants for producing databases with digitized geo-data

2. Enhance ASMEs entrepreneurial skills and access to finance, technology, market information and better regulation:

- Country trainings on mine and quarry management and Country training on entrepreneurship skills (marketing, financial/business management, value addition, quality control, etc.)
- Country training financial institutions, credit and guarantee providers
- Country sensitization workshops for ASMEs on small grants availability, finance and working capital
- Small grants for ASMEs to develop new products and improve value-addition skills

3. Strengthen Public institutions, communities, women's organisations and civil society organisations (CSOs) capacity to put in place social and environmental safeguards in mining and quarrying of Development Minerals:

- Country training and sensitization on environmental, health, safety standards
- Small grants to support environmental and social safeguards
- Country training, awareness on gender, human and labor rights, conflict management

4.Support Women-owned ASMEs to operate in the Development of Minerals value-chain:

- Country surveys and assessment on policy and regulatory frameworks for gender-sensitivity
- Country training regulators, local government, mineral buyers, financial institutions on gender
- Investor guides, handbooks, information packages promoting mineral products produced by women
- Country technology exhibitions, business fairs, networking events in selected countries

5. Possible collaboration and synergies:

- The project targets gender equality and women empowerment component in collaboration with UNWOMEN.
- Synergies with the University of Dschang in Cameroon to train ASMEs.
- The Programme is partnering with the World Bank, Association of Women in Mining in Africa and The University of Queensland to develop the DELVE Exchange, a global
 virtual network of artisanal ð and small-scale mining and quarrying associations. The DELVE Exchange will support knowledge exchange and peer learning on business
